

THE CONCLUSIONS OF PRAYERS IN THE LITTLE OFFICE

If the prayer is addressed to the Father it is concluded:

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, thy Son, who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.	Per Dominum nostrum Jesum Christum Filium tuum, qui tecum vivit et regnat in unitate Spiritus Sancti, Deus, per omnia sæcula sæculorum. Amen.

If the prayer is addressed to the Father, but mention is made of the Son in the beginning of it, it is concluded:

Through the same Jesus Christ, thy Son, our Lord, &c., as above.	Per eundem Dominum nostrum, &c., ut supra.

If the prayer is addressed to the Father, but mention is made of the Son at the end, it is concluded:

Who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.	Qui tecum vivit et regnat in unitate Spiritus Sancti, Deus, per omnia sæcula sæculorum. Amen.

GLORIA PATRI

Said at the conclusion of all psalms in the Office. It is not said at the conclusion of the Benedicite in Lauds.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.	Gloria Patri, et Filio: et Spiritui Sancto; Sicut erat in principio, et nunc, et semper: et in sæcula sæculorum. Amen.
